

Royal Welsh Show 2010

Hackleton Vixen from Hackleton Farms exhibited by Sam Brown sired by Brownhill Oswald whose dam was a homebred cow Hackleton Lorreta, took the eye of Jim Clarke of Garngour farm, Lanarkshire who was judging the British Blondes at the Royal Welsh show at Builth Wells.



Vixen also won the Female championship pipping her stable mate Hackleton Elicia to the title, Hackleton Elicia bred by Hackleton Farms, Northamptonshire. Out of Hackleton Serena, sired by Whistley Dollar Elicia born September 2009 was the youngest of the British Blondes shown which did not stop her winning the maiden heifer class.

Reserve champion went to Fronfedw Camwy, born September 2007, bred and exhibited by Rhidiann Davies from Lampeter whose dam was Fronfedw Patagones and sire is Fronfedw Virgil was up against her for the title of Reserve Champion. Camwy won the M C Davies perpetual trophy for senior heifer.



Bostock Destiniee bred and exhibited by Charlotte Boden from Cheshire, born January 2008 sired by Hillhead Anfield out of Hackleton Aimee won the intermediate heifer class.

Senior bull was won by Fronfedw Virgil born January 2004, sired by Fronfedw Rhyd-y-Beirdd out of Fronfedw Rala Rwdins.



He was awarded the ABP Shrewsbury Challenge Shield. Virgil exhibited and bred by Rhydian Davies who was thrilled to receive his shield from Sponsor of the Blonde classes Ifan Davies from Cig Coch Caron and his daughter Carrie. The Blonde Society were delighted that Mr Davies could be with them for the presentation.

Nick Rogers, though no newcomer to the British Blondes, having purchased his first heifers when he was just fourteen years old from the Kinaston herd through Carlisle market, was in fact a newcomer to the showing ring. Not that you would know it when Aaron Edoras bred and exhibited by Nick Rogers from Presteigne born March 2009 sired by Mir out of Kinaston Utsa went on to win the Midland Marts Perpetual trophy for the junior bull and reserve Male Champion.



The teams were a fine representation of the British Blondes when David and Sue Knight's Doncombe herd from Bristol won the group of three animals.
